

We Are Learning About:

Fire Safety

The children will explore and learn about how to stay safe if there is ever a fire. They will practice what to do if fire gets on their clothes. We will watch videos about fire safety and learn through stories, songs, and play-based activities.

Community Helpers

The children will learn about the amazing people who help keep our communities safe, clean and running smoothly. Each day we will explore a different community helper. The children can dress up during dramatic play center time, ask questions during circle time and learn about what it's like to be a firefighter, police officer, mail carrier, doctor, nurse and construction worker.

The children will explore the outside by collecting leaves, acorns and twigs.We will discuss how the season change.We will read stories about autumn, and explore the taste ,smell and textures of apples and pumpkins during snack time. During circle time, we will talk about colors, weather changes, how the animals prepare for the winter and healthy harvest foods.

The children will explore the real inside of a real pumpkin and talk about how pumpkins grow from seeds. We will count and sort the seeds by size and color. We will decorate pumpkins during arts and crafts time.
